Course Description:

English courses are designed to help students develop their skills in reading, writing, speaking/listening, and viewing / representing. In all English courses a variety of resources are used to promote skills and strategies for reading and to develop proficiency in oral and written communication. All areas of the English program foster development in intellectual analysis, personal assessment and collaboration. In addition, focus on community awareness and cultural diversity is an integral component of the English program.

The objectives of this course are to enhance the knowledge and appreciation of various genres of literature. In response to this literature, students will enhance their skills in the areas of critical thinking, writing (academic and creative), research, speaking, and reflecting on contemporary issues such as cultural diversity.
