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<u>French 8 Burnaby Online</u> Course Overview for Students and Parents

Bienvenue à la classe de Français 8! The general goal of this course is to build on previously learned concepts from previous French courses in elementary school, and to develop a level of proficiency in French language skills in four main communicative areas: reading, writing, speaking, and listening. It is the overall goal that students will be able to communicate in a second language in a variety of situations. In order to reach this goal, students will become competent in the language as much as possible.

Students this year will use a comprehensive program that will be further supplemented by other relevant resources. We will begin with a general review of basic concepts from grades 5-7 as we move through the study of the prescribed curriculum using the <u>Bien Dit</u> program. This program offers an integrative approach based on communicative objectives, linguistic components, along with cultural and educational activities.

Core Competencies

Teaching and learning in this course will focus on the 6 major Core Competencies as per district and provincial curriculum guidelines. These 6 Core Competencies are:

Communication: How students exchange information, experiences and ideas.

Creative Thinking: How students generate new ideas and take them from thought to reality. **Critical Thinking**: How students make judgements based on reasoning and available information.

Positive Personal & Cultural Identity: How students create healthy personal and cultural awareness in a pluralistic society.

Personal Awareness & Responsibility: How students develop awareness of skills and strategies to stay healthy both physically and mentally.

Social Responsibility: How students contribute positively to their families, community, society, and the environment.

Big Ideas

French 8 is based on these big idea concepts:

- Listening and viewing with intent deepens our understanding of French
- We can express ourselves and talk about the world around us in French.
- With increased fluency in French, we can participate more actively in reciprocal interactions.
- Stories allow us to communicate ideas in a meaningful way.
- Creative works allow us to experience culture in an authentic way.
- Acquiring a new language and learning about another culture deepen our understanding of our own language and culture.

The activities in this course are designed to address the learning standards as outlined in the BC Ministry of Education's French 8 curriculum document. Learning Standards are organized into Core Competencies, Curricular Competencies, and Content Goals. The French 8 curriculum consists of completing the first 5 chapters of the <u>Bien Dit</u> online textbook. The course consists of the following units and themes:

Chapter 1 - Language Basics - greetings, classroom vocabulary

- Chapter 2 Likes and dislikes
- Chapter 3 Friendship and family
- Chapter 4 School and shopping
- Chapter 5 Sports and Leisure, weather

Assessment

Your grade is split into two categories: coursework (70%) and tests (30%). You will complete all your coursework in Canvas and some quizzes.
