Course Name: Intro Italian 11

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Course Description

This course is a basic introduction to the Italian language for absolute beginners. Students taking this course will learn to identify Italian sounds, to write and pronounce the letters of the Italian Alphabet, to converse at an elementary level (introduce oneself and others, greetings, make basic inquiries, etc.) and to begin to express themselves using basic grammatical structures and vocabulary in matters mostly related to everyday life.

The cultural context of the language will also be covered by exploring a variety of the regions in the Italian Peninsula and their accompanying customs and traditions.

Big Ideas

Intro Italian 11 explores the following Big Ideas:

- Idea 1: Listening and viewing with intent supports our acquisition and understanding of a new language.
- Idea 2: Stories help us to acquire language and understand the world around us
- Idea 3: Expressing ourselves in a new language requires courage, risk taking, and perseverance.
- Idea 4: Exploring diverse forms of cultural expression allows us to experience and appreciate cultural diversity.
- Idea 5: Acquiring a new language provides a unique opportunity to access and interact with diverse communities.
