Course Description

Spanish 10 is a course that is designed for students who have already completed the novice level of Spanish in the Spanish 9 curriculum. Once this course is completed, students are ready to take Spanish 11. This course is designed to be completed at your own pace and is equivalent in both rigor and length as a regular in-class Spanish 10 course.

Big Ideas

Spanish 10 explores the following Big Ideas:

- Listening and viewing with intent supports our acquisition and understanding of a new language
- Stories give us unique ways to understand and reflect on meaning.
- Expressing ourselves in a new language requires courage, risk taking, and perseverance.
- Cultural expression can take many different forms
- Acquiring a new language provides a unique opportunity to access and interact with diverse communities.

- Unit 15: Feelings and Emotions, Tener expressions, Ponerse, Preterite Irregulars

- Unit 17: Nature, Geography, Vacations, Indirect Object Pronouns, Preterite of ER/IR verbs
